On Wednesday, we had our school review which is run in a similar format to Ofsted but involves our advisor from Devon, alongside other federation heads and English and Maths leads. All of these people spent the day looking at our curriculum planning, children's books, observing some teaching and most importantly talking to many groups of children about their learning across the subjects taught. The children all spoke clearly and positively about their learning whilst recognising the journey they are on. The overall feedback was very positive and the information has given us some minor things to tweak so we can continue to improve.



PARKING

Due to the requirements of the start and end of the day, schools by their very nature end up causing congestion around them. It is important, particularly in villages with narrow roads, like Whimple, that we all do what we can together to help minimise the impact of this for the locals who live here.

Parents are asked **not to** park in the hall car park as this is for hall users and the doctors surgery. The Thirsty Farmer continues to support the school by allowing parents to park there - please do this with consideration for others.

Be considerate of pedestrians - look around, especially when opening car doors.



Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

The new Exe Valley and Moorsway Federation governing board met for the first time on Tuesday this week to set up their new structure for the future. The federation board now comprises 15 governors with strategic responsibility for all ten schools in the new organisation. There are also three hub boards, East Exe Valley, West Exe Valley and Moorsway, who will meet during the first half of each term, alternating with the federation board meetings. New members were welcomed to the board and the statutory roles, such as safeguarding, attendance and SEND lead governors were confirmed. Jackie Enright was voted in as Chair of the federation, with Sheryl Margesson as Vice Chair with Louise Parry. The hub boards are due to meet over the next two weeks and will be focusing on the school improvement work of their member schools. Heads all write a report two weeks before the meetings and governors then submit questions during the following week. This gives them time to research their responses, which are shared at the board meetings. This gives governors an opportunity to challenge and support senior leaders in their role and ensures that a smaller group of governors stay in close contact with each of the Heads and are familiar with their schools. This connection between governors and each individual school is an important principle for us and will be increasingly important as the federation continues to evolve in the future.
